

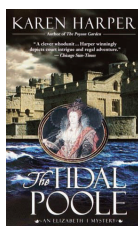

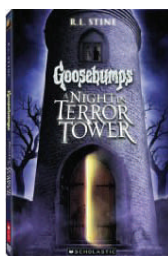
The Tidal Poole by Karen Harper

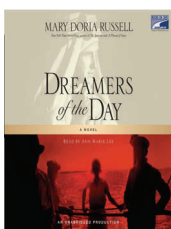
Goosebumps: A Night in Terror Tower DVD

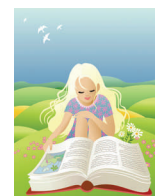
Dreamers of the Day

Havana Run by Les Standiford

John Deal has spent much of his adult life trying to rebuild the Miami construction firm that his late father ruined. When the possibility of a major project in post-normalized Cuba arises, he can't help but be intrigued—only to find that he's been lured to Havana for another, far more dangerous purpose: to help spring an American

prisoner from a Castro jail. Deal wants nothing to do with it, until he discovers who it is: a man closer to him than he could possibly have imagined, and the holder of secrets—secrets which more than one group would kill for . . . and soon do.

Hart Crane by Clive Fisher

Hart Crane's brilliant, complex poetry was the product of a troubled man's losing battle with himself. In this riveting biography, Fisher traces Crane's short life, which ended in suicide, not as a rise and fall but as the steady, inevitable unwinding of a soul.
