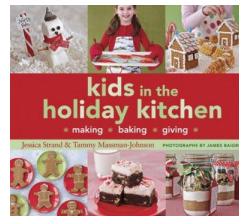
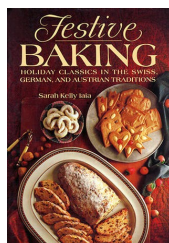


### The Big Book of Diabetic Desserts

### Kids in the Holiday Kitchen

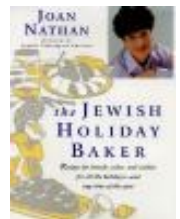
