- Marsha McDevitt-Stredney added a new exhibit case in the high-bay area of the library to feature items from our special collections.

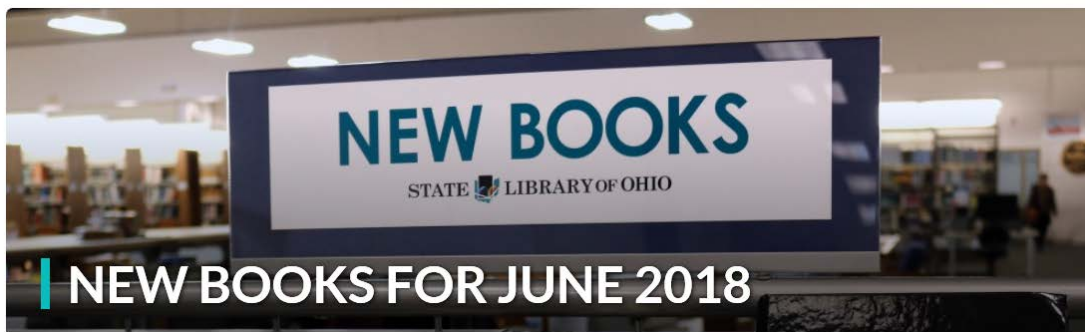


- The WWI exhibit at State Library continues to feature:

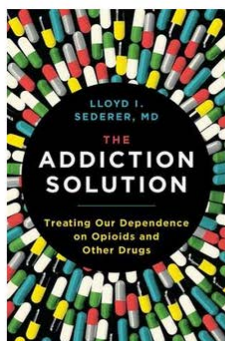

LSTA

- Libraries may apply for an Open Grant at any time. Information on Open Grants can be found at: <https://library.ohio.gov/services-for-libraries/lsta-grants/#AvailableGrants>.
- Open Grants were awarded to the Cincinnati Museum Center Library and Michael Schwartz Library, Cleveland State University.
- Twenty-eight applications for the Guiding Ohio Online program were received. Applications were reviewed and nineteen applications will be presented to the State Library Board in July for funding. This year's program was very competitive with the total requested amount exceeded the amount of funds available for the program.
- Applications for competitive grants are now being accepted. The RFP can be found at: <https://library.ohio.gov/services-for-libraries/lsta-grants/#AvailableGrants>. Competitive grants are being accepted in the following categories: Data Management and Analysis, Literacy, Outreach and Partnership, and STEM or STEAM. Applicants may apply for up to \$50,000 in federal funds and a 25% cash match of the total project cost is required. Completed proposals must be submitted to the State Library by 11:59 p.m. August 31, 2018. Recommended projects will be taken to the December State Library Board meeting and funded projects will begin January 1, 2019.

- Automation proposals that will allow a public library currently on a stand-alone ILS to migrate and join a consortium are still being accepted. A packet containing the RFP and a list of ILS consortia accepting new members was sent last summer to public library directors currently using a stand-alone ILS. Applications may be submitted at any time, and recommended proposals will be taken to the State Library Board for approval at the next available meeting.

Ohio Digital Library

- The Ohio Digital Library has reached 2 million items checked out for 2018! Curious about what titles are being checked out and placed on hold? [The Ohio Digital Library Dashboard](#) has a rolling feed of covers and shows live checkouts and holds being placed.
- Magazines are back in the Ohio Digital Library! Check out [this link](#) to browse the collection of 50 titles. Magazine checkouts do not count towards the overall checkout limit of 10 and there is no waiting! Multiple people can have the same magazine checked out at a time. Magazines can be read using the [Libby app](#) or via [OverDrive Read](#) in your device's internet browser.

Ohio Digital Network [Digital Public Library of America (DPLA) Project]

- Following the second harvest of Ohio Digital Network records, over 99,000 records from the Ohio Digital Network (ODN) hub are now published on [DPLA's website](#).
- Fourteen institutions from across Ohio have published records on DPLA.
- A survey was sent out to identify institutions in Phase 2 and beyond. Staff at ODN has been identifying, contacting and harvesting eligible institutions.
- Jen Johnson presented at the Great Lakes Resource Sharing Conference on June 8.
- With a grant from DPLA and the Knight foundation, ODN has been able to begin work with a design agency to create a website and logo. Stay tuned for details on the new website.
