



## LSTA

- Open grants were awarded to The College of Wooster, Cleveland Law Library Association, Perry Cook Public Library, Walnut Springs middle School/Westerville City Schools, Reed Memorial Library, and East Holmes Local School District.
- The State Library has announced a special LSTA grant for public libraries currently on a stand-alone ILS to migrate and join a consortium. The packet, containing the RFP and a list of ILS consortia accepting new members, was sent to public library directors currently using a stand-alone ILS. Applications are accepted at any time and recommended proposals will be taken to the State Library Board for approval at the next available meeting. Galion Public Library Association received a grant to join COOL.

# STATE LIBRARY OF OHIO

## Ohio Digital Library


- In 2017, 3,913,740 items were checked out from the Ohio Digital Library! The most popular format was Kindle Books closely followed by Adobe EPUB eBooks. Additionally, audiobook checkouts increased by 27% from 2016.

## Ohio Digital Network [Digital Public Library of America (DPLA) Project]

- Participation agreements have been sent to the institutions designated as Phase 1 institutions during the planning project. As institutions return their agreement, ODN staff begin working with them on selecting collections to include and reviewing metadata. To date 15 partner agreements have been returned.
- ODN has reached the 50,000 records to begin the harvest QA process with DPLA. After DPLA reviews the records, they will set up a harvest schedule with ODN.
- With a grant from DPLA and the Knight foundation, ODN has been able to begin work with a design agency to create a website and logo. Stay tuned for details on the new website.

- Three webinars are available on the ODN [YouTube channel](#): DPLA and the Ohio Digital Network, Rights Statements and Your Collections, and ODN Metadata Application Profile Introduction.

## Ohio Ready to Read

- [Digital Media Literacy Training](#) workshops will be scheduled in five Ohio locations in 2018. These free, one-day workshops will equip children's librarians and library specialists to confidently assist parents and caregivers as they navigate the digital world. The workshop is based on the Cuyahoga County Public Library's successful 2016 LSTA-funded train-the-trainer project which provided digital media literacy training to 400 children's librarians around Ohio.
